The purpose of this meeting was to discuss plans for Jackson's Town Court following the untimely passing of Justice Carl Ackley on August 9, 2018. The Honorable Vito Caruso, District Administrative Judge for the Fourth Judicial District has assigned Fort Ann Town Justice Dane L. Clark to hear and determine matters pending before Jackson Town Court for the period of August 14, 2018 through December 31, 2018 unless sooner terminated by Administrative Order.

RESOLUTION #69-18

A motion by Council[man] Rea, seconded by Councilwoman Rich; Resolution passed 5-0, **to compensate Justice Dane L. Clark with the remaining salary that Justice Ackley would have been paid in 2018.**

The elected position of the Town Justice will need to be on the November ballot. Both the Republican and Democratic Caucuses have been scheduled for Saturday, September 8, 2018 at the Town Hall. The Republican Caucus will start at 9 am. The Democratic Caucus will start at 10 am. Both will be short meetings so arrive on time.

If a Town resident is with another party, please contact Washington County Board of Elections immediately at 518-746-2180, as time to get on the November ballot is extremely limited.

A legal degree is NOT required to run for Town Justice. However, training for a newly elected Justice WILL be required and held December 3-7, 2018 in Albany. The meeting was adjourned at 1:25 pm.
